HEALTHY EARS

Last Tuesday staff and students were lucky enough to have a visit from the hearing team professionals. We discussed the impact that hearing loss has on student wellbeing and achievement. If your child has had a hearing test then the results are important for teachers to see. It is also important to note that if you or your child's teacher have concerns about your child's hearing then hearing tests for children under 9 years of age are only accurate for 3 months at a time. This is due to the growth rate of their Eustachian tube. You would have received a note regarding ear health and any concerns you may have please contact the school.

In the K/1 classroom and 5/6 classroom hearing assistance systems have been loaned for trial to our school from the DoE hearing team.

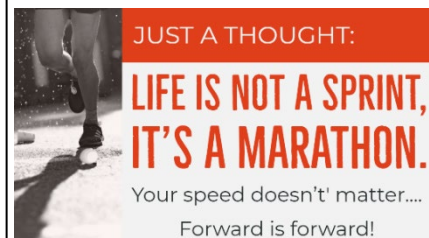

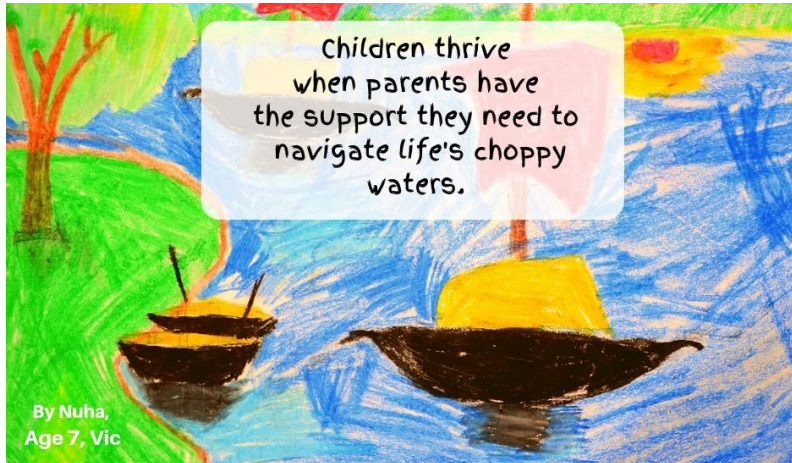

Proposed Day: Thursday Week 2 – Week 9

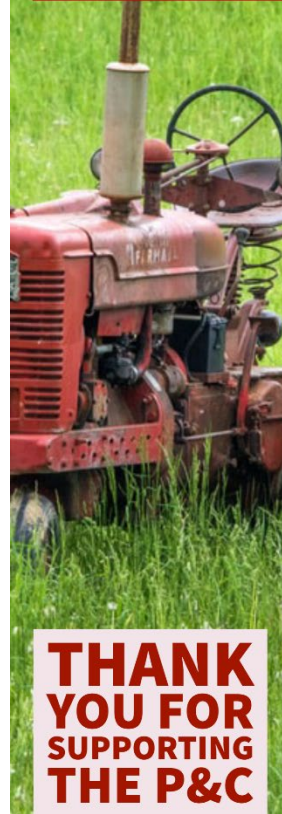
Transport to and from Wambangalang EEC included.
